Year 10 Crucible Theatre Trip:

The GCSE English Literature students attended a trip to see Arthur Miller's dark and thrilling play *The Crucible* at The Crucible Theatre, Sheffield on Thursday 14th March 2024. While *The Crucible* is not studied as part of our GCSE course, the themes of witchcraft and deception link with the students' study of Shakespeare's *Macbeth* and an understanding of this modern classic will really enhance the students' appreciation of plot, staging and characterisation. It was an electrifying night of theatre and especially encouraging for students who are considering further study of Literature at A-level. Look out for further theatre trips in the coming term - students are very keen so secure places as soon as possible.

KS4 Girls Netball Rotherham Cup Final:

Year 10 Netballers played incredibly yet again to be crown KS4 Rotherham schools Netball champions on 6th March! They always perform and represent Aston Academy to an amazing standard.

These students also went through to the Wickersley Netball Finals Day! The team dominated their semi-final against Wath to comfortably progress onto the final against Wickersley. In a repeat of the last years final, the girls knew that they would be pushed all the way by a very strong opponent. Captained by Bel S, the team gave every effort to try and retain their trophy. All players were outstanding but Eve E showed great resilience to battle on despite extreme pressure form their opposing players. Unfortunately, it wasn't to be this year as Wickersley claimed the trophy. However, the girls will be fighting hard to become champions again in Y11.

Behaviour, Punctuality and Attendance



So far this year we have had an absolutely huge number of achievement points collected by Y10 students! We are so proud of all the hard work and effort students have put in to achieve these, gaining points for the 5 core values - Ambition, pride, respect, responsibility and resilience.

Attendance for Y10 currently stands at **85.2%** for this half term. Although this is great, we really need to make sure that students attend every day! We do understand there are genuine reasons to not be in school, but for the majority of our students, we can make more of an effort to be present in school every day. We should all be aiming for 96% attendance as a minimum!

A huge congratulations to 10M2 who had the best attendance in the year - they were rewarded on Thursday with a buffet to celebrate their resilience for getting into school!

It is very important that all of our students are also on time to each of their lessons. The beginning of the lesson is when our students consolidate their previous learning through "Do Now" activities. This ensures they make the best possible progress in each lesson. Over the past few weeks a number of our students have been using punctuality cards to help them monitor and take responsibility for their own time management when moving between lessons. These have been issued by form tutors and have shown to be effective in improving punctuality. However, there are still a number of students who have work to do on this next term.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank you for supporting the Academy in raising uniform standards over this past half term. In line with this, could we also ask for your support in ensuring your child is continuing to adhere to the academy uniform policy. This includes:

- Wearing a clip on tie correctly on their top button
- Wearing appropriate approved school trousers or skirt
- Wearing academy blazer every day (not carrying this in their bag)
- Having suitable smart school shoes
- Not wearing excessive jewellery

Students should also have a school bag and planner every day as they are responsible for bringing their own books and equipment so they are prepared and ready to learn at the beginning of each lesson. Y10 will soon be "stepping up" as the current Y11 leave after their exams. This is an exciting time and, as Y10 enter their exam year, it is important our students are ready and prepared in order to make best progress towards their GCSEs.

ERIC - Everyone reading in class



Y10 students have really been getting involved with ERIC this term. It is lovely to see students reading in class as well as completing the ERIC challenge where they have been attending book club and the library, reading out loud and discussing books with adults to name a few!

We have also held a reading week where students looked at different texts in every lesson. We really want to encourage a passion for reading here at Aston!

Personal Development Pledge

We have been continuing with the 'Personal Development Pledge'. This has just been re-launced and students will have a booklet that they can fill in during tutor time to tick off what they have achieved. We want out students to leave school not just with the best qualifications they can but with life experience, self motivation, commitment to their community and to their personal growth - in short to be 'life ready'. Our personal development pledge is aimed to help support our young people in developing these qualities. Some of the tasks are small and easily gained, others require more dedication. We would encourage all our students to make achieving their bronze. silver and gold awards in the personal development pledge one of their New Year's resolutions. Personal development extends beyond school however, so with this in mind we would like to make you aware of some of the opportunities and activities available in the local authority for our students to be involved in over the Easter holidays.
