1 - The year team would like to thank all parents and students for your positive engagement in the year 9's options process. It was lovely to see so many of you attend the options presentation and to have so many mature conversations with year 9 students about their aspirations for the future and plans to make a positive start to their GCSEs. The online application process worked extremely well and has now closed. Notification of what options students have been allocated will be sent out during the next half term. This is an exciting time for our young people as they begin to take more responsibility for their own learning journey and we look forward to supporting them as they enter the next stage of their education.



2 - As part of the PSHE curriculum and assembly programme we have begun to think about future careers. We aim to broaden students' awareness of the vast range of different careers available, for example visiting speakers from the NHS have led a variety of assemblies to inform students of the many varied roles they offer from healthcare professionals, to finance, to prosthetics, to IT based careers. This is just a starting point. Over the next two years students will have access to one to one meetings with our careers advisor, work experience opportunities and careers fayres. Practice Makes Perfect



We would like to celebrate and commend the resilience and excellent standards demonstrated by year 9 in the recent Standardised Summative Assessments. For the very first time, year 9 experienced completing their assessments in exam conditions. This is an essential student training exercise. As we move into GCSE courses in year 10 students need to be fully aware of and understand JCQ expectations for students sitting public examinations. They need to understand the procedures for entry and exit of exam venues, requirements for equipment, the role of invigilators and much more. As a year team we

were absolutely delighted with how the students rose to this challenge. Year 9 were absolutely SUPERB in the assessment venues! A huge well done to you all, we were incredibly proud of you.



Learning for Life - enrichment opportunities

We would like to share with you how extremely proud we were this week of our year 9 students who visited Beth Shalom Holocaust Memorial Centre in Newark. This trip, organised by the RPE faculty, is an experience which hundreds of Aston students have gained from over the last 15 years. It provides our young people with opportunity to reflect on this dark period in human history, to develop empathy for and understanding of the suffering humans have at times caused one another, in the hope that through raising awareness we can prevent such events in the future. Students had the the chance to visit the exhibition centre to learn about the history of the Holocaust, the chance to reflect in the memorial gardens and the opportunity to hear a survivor/person touched by the Holocaust tell their story and explain the impact it had on them and their families' lives. We were so proud of year 9 who behaved maturely throughout, showing consideration and respect for the seriousness of the subject matter. I know it will be an experience they will remember and would encourage you to discuss with them what they learned from the experience.

Aston's 5 core values at work



We have continued to work hard this term to embed further our core values of pride, responsibility, respect, resilience and ambition. We have recently introduced the Aston Conduct Card for students, this enables students to gain additional praise points for positive behaviours/actions such as helping out, acts of kindness, contribution to the school community and many other things. Students should have this card with them at all times so that if a member of staff witnesses them do something worthy of praise they can sign their card. These points are logged and go towards achieving rewards and a place in the Top 100 rewards scheme at the end of each term. Alongside this we are still running the personal development pledge scheme. Don't forget year 9 to work towards gaining your bronze, silver or gold award! In the coming term we will be looking at providing opportunity for students to take roles of responsibility within the school such as faculty support assistants. These voluntary roles will be advertised over coming weeks and will provide our students with a real life experience of applying for a post, interviewing and holding down a position of responsibility.

They recently played Wickersley in the semi-final and played some excellent Netball to keep the scores close as they moved into the final quarter.
